Certification:

To be issued jointly by MEA and Embassy of Japan.

- Age limit 20-60 years.
- JLPT (Japanese-Language Proficiency Test) N3 level or above.
- Mentally as well as physically strong individuals.
- Non-native Japanese speakers.
